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Uhat is the Salam Project?

The Salam Project is **a unique approach** to the presentation and promotion of Islam in Sweden, a country at the very forefront of the modern secularised Western world.

At the heart of the Salam Project lies the Quranic and Prophetic injunction of **guiding one's own community** first. All of the prophets of God were sent to their own peoples. Similarly, whenever a companion entered into the fold of Islam, the first thing the Prophet would do was to send them back to their own tribe, community or people to convey the message.

In the spirirt of reviving this prophetic tradition, the Salam Project aims to **present Islam to the West** in a way that makes it understandable and approachable to the Western mind.

The Salam Project also aims to **meet the spiritual needs** of Swedish Muslims. It is our duty to take care of and strengthen those who come into Islam, in order to ensure that they remain in the faith, and develop and strengthen their practice, their faith and their relation with Allah.

The Salam Project strives to increase the understanding of Islam in Swedish society, by **promoting Islamic art and culture** in Sweden and giving people a positive experience of Islam to counter negative associations.







Uhy is the Salam Project needed?

When people in the West today hear the word "Islam" a whole range of **inaccurate information** and bad stereotypes immediately spring to mind. This presents a great obstacle for people wanting to find out more about Islam.

We feel that we **owe it to our community** to give them a chance to acquire a genuine understanding of Islam without being pushed away by the negative associations they have experienced through the media, or from interactions with the Muslim community.

Most Islamic organisations and institutes in the West today are primarily concerned with the benefit and affairs of the Muslim community. While this in itself is a worthy cause, it is not necessarily the same thing as **serving the cause of Islam** in the society where one lives. An entirely different approach is needed.

For many people, it is not easy to enter a mosque or approach an Islamic organisation as the first contact with Islam, hence there is a need for an interface or **meeting place** where people in a relaxed atmosphere can acquaint themselves with the reality of Islam.

Too often when people present Islam, the focus is on social, political and outward aspects. While these are all important parts of our faith, they do not convey the bigger picture. We believe there is an urgent need of **presenting Islam as a holistic religion**, a living faith, a complete way of life.

He currently works as imam at Masjid Aysha in Stockholm, and teaches at a Muslim adult education college. He is often called to interculutral dialogues and to represent Islam in the Swedish media.

Max Abdussalam Dahlstrand

became Muslim in 1994 at the age of 23. After finishing his Architecture degree in the US, he worked on several mosque projects in Sweden and was active in the Swedish Muslim Youth association. He later founded Sidratul Muntaha together with Mohammad Muslim, to which he now dedicates most of his free time, reaching out to people daily. He also manages a health care company for people with disabilities.

Sueden – a brief overview


Despite traditionally being considered a Christian country, Sweden is often mentioned as the **most secularised nation** in the world. In a country where believers of any kind are seen as breaking the norm, roughly 5% of the total population are of Muslim background.

As a religion that largely made its way to the country by way of recent immigration, the **Muslim presence** is not very well established. There are not many functioning institutions or madrasas, and only a few purpose built mosques throughout the whole country.

There is a growing need to present Islam in a positive light to the Swedish public. Most people in Sweden receive their information about Islam entirely through the **mainstream media**, where Islam is stereotypically shown in a negative light. In spite of this, most people respond positively when presented with a balanced and genuine image of Islam.

During seminars and theme days at schools, as well school visits to mosques, we are constantly surprised by the **positive reactions** and enthusiasm of these young people who are prepared to see past stereotypes and misconceptions and really want to develop a more indepth and accurate understanding of Islam.

There is an urgent need for **promoting Islam** through various channels of engagement.







– our achievements so far

The Sidratul Muntaha organisation was founded by a group of Swedish Muslims in 2003 with the goal of promoting **a positive image** of Islam in Sweden.

Since then we have lectured to tens of thousands of students in **schools, colleges and universities**, and received hundreds of school classes at the mosque.

We have held well over a hundred **full day courses** educating thousands of non-Muslim professionals all around Sweden about Islam and Muslim culture.

We have also delivered a large amount of seminars and workshops, **inter-religious dialogues**, integration projects, camps for new Muslims, weekly gatherings, counselling sessions and many other activities.

Through our work, we have become established and recognised in Sweden as a **well respected organisation**, with many influential contacts, including both national and local authorities, the press, churches and other religious organisations, embassies etc.

Our activities have received **much positive coverage** in the media including national television, radio and newspapers.







The next step – establishing the Salam Foundation

Until now we have been able to keep our activities running through **voluntary work** in our free time.

However, in order to expand further and properly realise our vision, we are **in need of more resources**. In the present situation, we are no longer able to fully dedicate our time and effort into our activities as much as needed.

Therefore, we seek **your support and advice** on how to fund our activities in the future. Firstly to cover our current costs, primarily salaries to be able to carry on our work full time. We also need funds for litterature, seminars, camps, exhibitions and other activities.

In the future we will also need to employ **more course leaders** to present Islam around the country, and administrators to organise events and activities.

For the next step, we are in need of further resources in order to purchase, furnish and maintain a suitable location for the centre. We firmly believe that this would **fill a large void** in the current landscape of Islam in Sweden, and Swedish society in general.

The idea is specifically not to build another mosque, but rather to launch an entirely **new concept for dawah** in Sweden.









In the future, we aim to establish a permanent centre to cater for our new Muslim brothers and sisters, establish a bureau and resource centre for information and support, and most importantly we hope to **create an open environment** – a drop-in centre where both Muslims and others can gain traditional Islamic knowledge, partake in Muslim cultural activities and receive accurate information about Islam.

For many people – including some Muslims – it is not always easy to approach a mosque when looking to find information and to experience the **practical and spiritual dimensions** of Islam.

That is why we want to create a place that has a lower threshold, a more **welcoming atmosphere**, where people can come as they are and in a comfortable environment have access to Islamic knowledge and meet knowledgeable people who can present Islam, answer their questions and show them, through practical experience, how people live Islam.

In the longer term, we envisage a book café, a library, exhibition spaces and dedicated areas for seminars, workshops and cultural activities. In brief, **a Muslim cultural center**, strategically situated in the heart of Sweden's capital city, Stockholm.

Our hope is that the new Salam Center will function as a hub for places of **Islamic propagation and support** all over Europe.









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
